Food, Cash, Medicaid, & Unemployment Benefits



PUBLIC MEDICAL ASSITANCE



Michigan offers several medical assistance programs, with varying eligibility criteria. Basic eligibility criteria for Medicaid includes living in Michigan, residing in a low-income household, and either being a U.S. Citizen or qualifying legal resident.

UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS



Individuals who have recently experienced involuntary jobloss or a significant reduction in wages are eligible to receive unemployment benefits in the State of Michigan. Immigrants with work authorization are eligible as long as they:

- 1) Meet a state-determined minimum amount of wages earned over the past 6 months 2) Are actively seeking work

REFUGEE ASSISTANCE & MIGRANT WORKER SERVICES



The State of Michigan provides <u>refugees</u> with cash and medical assistance for up to 8 months after entry into the U.S.

Employment services, health screenings, foster care services for unaccompanied minors, and specific services for <u>migrant workers</u> are also available via Michigan Bridges.

CHILDCARE ASSISTANCE

MICHIGAN BRIDGES: FOOD & CASH ASSISTANCE



Food Assistance Eligibility:

- Must live in Michigan
- Be a low-income household
- Must be a U.S. Citizen, refugee, special category immigrant, a permanent legal resident that is disabled or affiliated with the U.S. Military, or a foreign-born child under 18



<u>Temporary Cash Assistance:</u>

- Must live in Michigan
- Be a low-income household with minor children or a pregnant woman
- Must be a U.S. citizen or be a special category immigrant
- Foreign-born children under 18 are also eligible
